## **Scripture Readings**

### Colossians 3:12-16 (Epistle)

Brethren, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering; bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do. But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection. And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; and be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.

### Luke 18:35-43 (Gospel)

At that time, as the Lord was coming near Jericho, that a certain blind man sat by the road begging. And hearing a multitude passing by, he asked what it meant. So they told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by. And he cried out, saying, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Then those who went before warned him that he should be quiet; but he cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" So Jesus stood still and commanded him to be brought to Him. And when he had come near, He asked him, saying, "What do you want Me to do for you?" He said, "Lord, that I may receive my sight." Then Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight; your faith has made you well." And immediately he received his sight, and followed Him, glorifying God. And all the people, when they saw it, gave praise to God.

#### Venerable Macarius the Great of Egypt

Saint Macarius the Great of Egypt, born in the early fourth century, is celebrated for his humility, asceticism, and profound spiritual wisdom. Widowed early, he forsook worldly pursuits to devote himself to prayer, penitence, and the care of his aging parents. Guided by an Elder, he mastered fasting, prayer, and watchfulness while living in a desert cell. Despite preferring solitude, his virtuous life led to his ordination as a deacon and later a priest. Known for enduring slander and demonic temptations with humility, Saint Macarius continually sought peace in isolation. His humility earned him spiritual power, allowing him to heal, perform miracles, and guide others to salvation.

Saint Macarius taught that true faith and love for God, paired with obedience to His commandments, are essential for salvation. His writings, including Fifty Spiritual Homilies and Ascetic Treatises, offer insights into communion with God and the transformative power of the Holy Spirit. Emphasizing the balance of divine grace and human effort, his life of miracles, prayer, and humility remains a beacon for those seeking holiness. Saint Macarius passed away at ninety, leaving a legacy of theological wisdom, his relics enshrined in Amalfi, Italy, and his teachings alive in the Church.
